

Hughes, Langton win medals

Ten members of the Pinkerton Academy girls' track team traveled to Methuen last Friday to take part in the sixth annual Methuen Invitational track meet for girls.

Two of the Astros came home medal winners.

Sophomore Sherri Hughes, seeded second in a field of 25 runners, won the 50-yard dash with a time of 6.1 seconds, only one-tenth of a second off the field house record.

Hughes won both of her quarter-final heats in 6.3 seconds, setting up a final-heat showdown against 1980 winner Heidi Thomson of Falmouth and 1981 winner Davynne Williams of Andover.

Hughes came smoking out of the blocks to win the race, with Thomson second and Williams third.

"Sherri really looked great in that final heat" said coach Kathy O'Connell. "She's been working on her starts, trying to get the kinks out. It was, by far, her best performance of the season. More than one coach commented on her performance."

Junior middle-distance runner Heather Langton was seeded eighth in a field of 30, which put her in a slower heat in the 1,000 meter yard run.

Langton placed second in her heat with a time of 2:53.0, good enough to give her the sixth place medal.

"Heather is a gutsy runner who gives it her all", said O'Connell. "She still has to work on her form and upper-body strength, but it's

coming. She did a great job."

Hughes' and Langton's 11 points put Pinkerton, the only out-of-state school in the meet, fourteenth overall in a field of 28 teams. Andover won the meet.

Both Margaret Consalvi and Sharon Chadwick improved their best times in the 300 yard dash, as did Dianne Cameron in the 1,000 yard run. Amy Blenis won her heat in the 600 with a time of 1:40.

Frosh distance runners Amy Kruschwitz and Bridget Riley competed in the mile run. Running in the younger of the two heats in that event, Kruschwitz and Riley finished one-two with times of 5:49.8 and 5:49.9, respectively.

"They were out of the money as far as awards went, but they certainly ran well", said O'Connell. "They've been improving steadily as the season goes along."

Mary Sheridan and Beth Latham ran in a talent-laden two mile run, which was won by Dartmouth Relay runner-up Mary Schena of Haverhill. Sheri-

dan managed to place a respectable eighth.

The mile relay of Blenis, Chadwick, Latham and Hughes ran a season best of 4:31.4, with Chadwick running a 65.8 second 440 and Hughes a 64.4.

"The meet was superbly run", said O'Connell. "With 200 girls participating, it was very smooth and organized. Meet director Dan Moynihan and crew should be commended."

"I'm pleased with our girls' performances. Improvement is the name of the game and most of the girls improved. We watched in awe at some of the Massachusetts talent. Track is such a prestigious sport at many of their schools. This is something very evident when you see the girls on and off the track."

"It's something we're trying to create at Pinkerton, but we have a long way to go. We need more girls who are not afraid to work hard", O'Connell said.

The full Astro squad will be back in action tomorrow night with a 6 o'clock meet at the University of New Hampshire.



PA girls easily win track meet

Durham — A 'cool' and rejuvenated Pinkerton Academy girls' track team got back into regular season action at the University of New Hampshire Friday night, beating Winnacunnet and Exeter in a Tri-meet.

The Astros finished with 76½ points, Winnacunnet had 24¼ and Exeter had 16¼ points. For the second time this season, Concord was a no-show.

Beth Latham got back into form, winning the 3,000 meter race (10:57) and the 1,500 (5:15.3). Junior Amy Blenis ran her best time, winning the 600 with a time of 1:51.6, which qualifies her for the state meet.

Junior Mary Sheridan took second place in two events - the 3,000 and 1,000. Frosh Amy Kruschwitz took 12 seconds off her best time in the 1,500, finishing second with a time of 5:18.3.

Placing third for the Astros

were Bridget Riley (3,000), Diane Cameron (1,000), Bonnie Chadwick (600, 1:56.0, her best this season), Karen Flynn (1,500, 5:30.1, season best), Donna Lewis (hurdles, 9.9 seconds, season best) and Blenis (high jump).

Fourth-place finishers for Pinkerton were Cameron (3,000), Debbie Simard (long jump, 14'7", season best), Kim Zito (dash), Kathy Smith (1,000), Blenis (300), Riley (1,500), Julie Webster and Deb Simard (tie, high jump).

The relay team of Lewis, Chadwick, Cameron and Pattie Foster took first place. Foster, along with Diana Colburn, was running her first meet of the year after an early season injury.

"It was a productive and fun night for the girls", said O'Connell. "We had some good performances and a record number of parents, friends and alumni came to support the girls. It makes it so much more worthwhile when you can see your work pay off and people are there supporting and appreciating your efforts."

The Astros have one more regular-season meet before the February 5 state meet. Friday, the squad will go against Timberlane, Spaulding, Londonderry, Concord and Alvirne. The meet ("it'll be a tough one" - O'Connell) starts at 6 o'clock at UNH.

On Sunday, three Astros participated in the New England TAC track and field championships at Boston University. The meet featured high school, college, and unattached runners from throughout New England.

Sherri Hughes placed third in the quarter-finals of the dash, advancing to the semi-finals, where she placed fourth in her heat. Hughes also ran a very respectable time of 26.2 seconds

Beth Latham paced the Astros' runners by winning the 3,000 meter run with a time of 10:55.0 and

the 1,500 meter run with a time of 5:15.0.

Sherri Hughes won the 300 meter dash for Pinkerton in a time of 43.2 and took a second in the 55 meter dash with a time of 7.2 and a third in the 55 meter hurdles with a time of 9.7.

Also for the winners, Heather Langton placed first in the 1,000 meter run with a time of 3:17.7 and was second in the high jump at 4-8.

Pinkerton will next run in the State Meet next Friday (6 p.m.) at U.N.H.

Pinkerton gals win

Pinkerton Academy, tuning up for next Saturday's All-State Track Meet, rolled up 140½ points to far outdistance runnerup Timberlane with 81½ yesterday at the University of New Hampshire.

Rounding out the six-team girls field were Spaulding 58, Londonderry 28, Alvirne 19 and Concord 12.

Pinkerton's Beth Latham was a double winner for the Astros.

Miss Latham won the 3000 meter run in 10:56.4 with teammates Mary Sheridan and Reilly second and third. Miss Latham also took the 1500 meter run in 5:14.

The other Astro winner was Heather Langton in the 1000 meter run in 3:17.7

Second place finishers for Pinkerton were Sherri Hughes, 55 meter hurdles and Miss Langton in the high jump and long jump.

Patsy Booker won the 600 for Timberlane in 1:46.5 and had a second place in the 300. Lynne Burke won the long jump at 16-0 and had thirds in the 300 and 55 meter dash. Jenny Wiggins had a second in the shot put and Cheryl Mitchell had a second in the 600.

The Timberlane mile relay team of Mitchell, Rachael Beattie, Diana Parly and Michelle Snowden also produced a first place in 4:36.4.

Astro girls to defend state title

Durham — Pinkerton Academy's girls' winter track team will be defending its 1981 state championship tomorrow night in the State Meet at the University of New Hampshire (6:30).

The Astros pulled another win out of their hats last Friday night, finishing with 140½ points. Timberlane had 81½ points, followed by Spaulding with 58, Londonderry with 28, Alvirne with 19 and Concord with 12.

Seven Astros will be competing in the state meet tomorrow night, with three of them having qualified for the maximum of four events.

Sherri Hughes has qualified in the long jump, hurdles, 55 meter dash and 300 meter dash (in which she is the top-ranked runner), and Heather Langton has qualified in the long and high jumps, the 1,000 meter race and the 300. Both have scratched the long jump and will run on the relay team.

"Both have made improvements in the long jump", said coach Kathy O'Connell, "but we feel it's best for them to by-pass it this year in favor of concentrating on their other events."

Senior Beth Latham has her choice of four distance events:

the 1,500, the 3,000, the 1,000 and the 600. She will run the 3,000 (in which she is ranked second) and the 1,500 (ranked fourth).

Junior Mary Sheridan will drop the 1,000, and concentrate on the 3,000 (ranked sixth) and the 1,500.

Of the 10 frosh to qualify for the state meet, two are Astros. Bridget Riley will run the 3,000 (seeded seventh) and the 1,500, while Amy Kruschwitz will drop the 3,000 in favor of the 1,500, in which she is ranked eighth.

Rounding out the "Astro seven" is track newcomer junior Amy Blenis, who has qualified in the 600. Pinkerton's relay team will have Hughes, Langton, Margaret Consalvi and Sharon Chadwick, with Donna Lewis and Blenis alternates.

Coaches O'Connell and Betty Shepard see the meet as a dog fight between Central and Nashua. "Both squads have depth", said O'Connell. "we don't have the numbers this year to go for the top spots, but will concentrate on individual achievements in hopes it will get us in the top six".

Pinkerton finished the season with a 15-1 record, and has compiled a 52-4 record in the three years with O'Connell as coach.

6 records set in girls' state meet

It's Worthley in hurdles, Marioti in 1,500 Nashua wins team title by wide margin

DURHAM — Six state records were set and two local runners earned first-place medals at last night's girls' state indoor track meet at the Paul Sweet Oval at the University of New Hampshire.

Nashua breezed to the team title with 81 points, well ahead of runnerup Manchester Central's 53. The Purple Panthers got just two winning efforts, but placed in most events to take the championship. Local victors were Spaulding's Robin Worthley in the 55-meter hurdles and Jenny Marioti of Dover in the 1,500.

Worthley, a Red Raider senior, also ran second to Cecelia Kindgren's record-setting performance in the 55-meter dash. Worthley's win in the hurdles, an 8.1-second effort, was one of six new state marks established.

Other local runnersup were Exeter High's Leslie Nichols, who was edged by a half-second in the 1,000 by Pinkerton's Langton, and Somersworth's Sara Belyea, who leapt five feet along with Nashua's Gill but lost on more misses.

After Central in team scoring came Pinkerton (51), Timberlane (31), Spaulding (24), Portsmouth (19), Oyster River (12), Dover (10), West (10) and Keene (10). Exeter (9) and Somersworth (8) closed out the local scoring.

Ellen Abbott of Central captured the 3,000 with a 10:44.1 clocking, and Jenny Curtis of OR ran fourth.

Keene's Darcy Smith set the night's first record in the shotput, with a throw of 40-feet, 8-inches. Exeter's Bassett finished sixth in the event.

Kindgren edged Worthley in the dash, setting a new meet record of 7.2 seconds, just ahead of Worthley's 7.3.

Pinkerton's Langton then edged Nichols in the 1,000 with a 3:09.1 time compared to Nichols' 3:09.6, and Timberlane took the next two events. Patsy Booker won the 600 in 1:41.6 (another record), and the Owls' Lynn Burke set another mark in the long jump with a 17-foot, 6½-inch jump. Oyster River's Sarah Yount finished fourth in the long jump.

Worthley and Nashua's Sherry Gagnon were both clocked in 8.1 seconds in the 55-meter hurdles, but Worthley captured the event at the tape. OR's Yount took sixth place.

Marioti then captured Dover High's only points with her win in the 1,500, and Curtis placed in the event, taking sixth. Pinkerton's Sheri Hughes ran 42.6 for another meet standard, well ahead of OR's Mary Rogers in fifth. Gill then topped Belyea in the high jump, and Central won the final event, the relay, with Nashua second. Spaulding finished fifth in the relay.

Two Astro girls state champs

Durham — After battling top-rated Central for second place the entire night, Pinkerton Academy's girls' winter track team settled for a third place finish in the state championship meet last Friday.

Nashua won the meet with 81 points, Central was second with 53 and Pinkerton had 51. Timberlane (31 points) and Spaulding (24), rounded out the top five. There were 21 teams in the meet.

Two Astro runners emerged as state champions in the meet. Sophomore Sherri Hughes, last year's 55 meter dash state champ, won the 300 Friday. Her time of 42.6 seconds set a new state record.

Junior Heather Langton, ranked fourth in the 1,000 before the meet, ran a smart race then pulled away in the final lap. Her time of 3:09.1 was 8.6 seconds faster than her qualifying time, only .4 seconds off the state record.

Pinkerton and Central battled for the second-place finish throughout the meet, but the Little Green's relay team edged the final event. Pinkerton's relay team of Hughes, Langton, Sharon Chadwick and Margaret Consalvi cut seven seconds off its season's best time, 4:24.

Pinkerton's distance trio of Beth Latham, Mary Sheridan and Bridget Riley got things going for the Astros, taking second, fifth and sixth.

Latham, the only Pinkerton senior to qualify for state

competition, ran a season's best time of 10:46.6. Riley nipped Sheridan at the wire for fifth, finishing with a time of 11:31.6 to Sheridan's 11:32.

The hurdles, in which Hughes was ranked 11th, were next. In that event, Hughes' best previous time was 9.1 seconds. On Friday, though, she ran two trials of 8.5 seconds, then ran the final heat in 8.8 seconds for third place.

"We thought Sherri might be able to get into the semis and gain a little hurdle experience", said coach Kathy O'Connell, "But a third place in her initial year as a hurdler is a great accomplishment, and speaks for her desire to excel."

After the hurdles, Hughes ran a 7.3 to finish third in the 55, then ran for the state record in the 300. She also ran one leg of the relay in 62.5 seconds.

After that, Langton, who had cleared 4'8" in the high jump, won the 1,000. "We knew she could do it all along, and I think after two years with winter track, now she's starting to believe in herself", said O'Connell. "She just did a super job."


Junior Amy Blenis ran the 600 in 1:51.0. That event was won by Timberlane's Patsy Booker in a record time of 1:41.6.

Latham then took fourth in the 1,500 (5:11.5) and frosh Amy Kruschwitz placed seventh in that event.

Nashua had clinched the win by then, but second came down to the relay, won by Central.



"The meet should feature some of the better talent in Northern Massachusetts", said Pinkerton coach Kathy O'Connell. "It will give our people the chance to run against the Merrimack Valley's best."

The Astros were certainly not going against the best last Friday in one of their easiest wins in recent years.

Freshmen Bridget Riley and Amy Kruschwitz started things off by placing 1-2 in the 3,000 meter race. Riley, with a time of 11:30.7 and Kruschwitz (11:35.9) took 14 and eight seconds, respectively, off their previous best times.

Senior co-captain Dianne Cameron was third in the 3,000.

Riley and Kruschwitz again combined for the first two spots in the 1,500. Riley won with a time of 5:30, and Kruschwitz finished in 5:31.2. Karen Flynn was fourth for the Astros.





Hughes, Langton win medals

Ten members of the Pinkerton Academy girls' track team traveled to Methuen last Friday to take part in the sixth annual Methuen Invitational track meet for girls.

Two of the Astros came home medal winners.

Sophomore Sherri Hughes, seeded second in a field of 25 runners, won the 50-yard dash with a time of 6.1 seconds, only one-tenth of a second off the field house record.

Hughes won both of her quarter-final heats in 6.3 seconds, setting up a final-heat showdown against 1980 winner Heidi Thomson of Falmouth and 1981 winner Davynne Williams of Andover.

Hughes came smoking out of the blocks to win the race, with Thomson second and Williams third.

"Sherri really looked great in that final heat" said coach Kathy O'Connell. "She's been working on her starts, trying to get the kinks out. It was, by far, her best performance of the season. More than one coach commented on her performance."

Junior middle-distance runner Heather Langton was seeded eighth in a field of 30, which put her in a slower heat in the 1,000 meter yard run.

Langton placed second in her heat with a time of 2:53.0, good enough to give her the sixth place medal.

"Heather is a gutsy runner who gives it her all", said O'Connell. "She still has to work on her form and upper-body strength, but it's

coming. She did a great job."

Hughes' and Langton's 11 points put Pinkerton, the only out-of-state school in the meet, fourteenth overall in a field of 28 teams. Andover won the meet.

Both Margaret Consalvi and Sharon Chadwick improved their best times in the 300 yard dash, as did Dianne Cameron in the 1,000 yard run. Amy Blenis won her heat in the 600 with a time of 1:40.

Frosh distance runners Amy Kruschwitz and Bridget Riley competed in the mile run. Running in the younger of the two heats in that event, Kruschwitz and Riley finished one-two with times of 5:49.8 and 5:49.9, respectively.

"They were out of the money as far as awards went, but they certainly ran well", said O'Connell. "They've been improving steadily as the season goes along."

Mary Sheridan and Beth Latham ran in a talent-laden two mile run, which was won by Dartmouth Relay runner-up Mary Schena of Haverhill. Sheri-

dan managed to place a respectable eighth.

The mile relay of Blenis, Chadwick, Latham and Hughes ran a season best of 4:31.4, with Chadwick running a 65.8 second 440 and Hughes a 64.4.

Beth Latham got back into form, winning the 3,000 meter race (10:57) and the 1,500 (5:15.3). Junior Amy Blenis ran her best time, winning the 600 with a time of 1:51.6, which qualifies her for the state meet.

Junior Mary Sheridan took second place in two events - the 3,000 and 1,000. Frosh Amy Kruschwitz took 12 seconds off her best time in the 1,500, finishing second with a time of 5:18.3.

Placing third for the Astros

were Bridget Riley (3,000), Dianne Cameron (1,000), Bonnie Chadwick (600, 1:56.0, her best this season), Karen Flynn (1,500, 5:30.1, season best), Donna Lewis (hurdles, 9.9 seconds, season best) and Blenis (high jump).

Fourth-place finishers for Pinkerton were Cameron (3,000), Debbie Simard (long jump, 14'7", season best), Kim Zito (dash), Kathy Smith (1,000), Blenis (300), Riley (1,500), Julie Webster and Deb Simard (tie, high jump).

The relay team of Lewis, Chadwick, Cameron and Pattie Foster took first place. Foster, along with Diana Colburn, was running her first meet of the year after an early season injury.

"It was a productive and fun night for the girls", said O'Connell. "We had some good performances and a record number of parents, friends and alumni came to support the girls. It makes it so much more worthwhile when you can see your work pay off and people are there supporting and appreciating your efforts."

The Astros have one more regular-season meet before the February 5 state meet. Friday, the squad will go against Timberlane, Spaulding, Londonderry, Concord and Alvirne. The meet ("it'll be a tough one" - O'Connell) starts at 6 o'clock at UNH.

On Sunday, three Astros participated in the New England TAC track and field championships at Boston University. The meet featured high school, college, and unattached runners from throughout New England.

Sherri Hughes placed third in the quarter-finals of the dash, advancing to the semi-finals, where she placed fourth in her heat. Hughes also ran a very respectable time of 26.2 seconds

1981: There was seldom a dull moment

To modify an expression, there was seldom a dull moment in area sports in 1981.

The year started with the tough task of topping the events of 1980. Apparently, area athletes were up to the task.

After a slow and somewhat uneventful month of January, things started to happen shortly after Ground Hog Day. The Pinkerton Academy girls' winter track team was the first big success story of 1981. On February 6, the Astros upset runaway favorites Nashua and Portsmouth to capture the state championship, under coach Kathy O'Connell.

The first event of the day got the Astros rolling. In that event (the 3,000 meter race), Pinkerton runners took the first three places (Beth Latham, first; Karyn Tomaini, second; and Mary Sheridan, third).

From there, the Astros just kept going: Latham, Tomaini, Sheridan and Lynn Wentworth were third through sixth in the 1,500; Cheryl Chadwick and Sherri Hughes tied for second in the 300; Hughes, a freshman, won the 55 meter dash in a showdown with Spaulding's Mary Worthley; and, finally, the relay team of Chadwick, Joanne Salter, Hughes and Heather Langton set a state record.

The next day, the increasingly successful Londonderry High School track program came up with the first of its many 1981 successes. The boys' winter track team, under coach Al Halpern, took second in Class I. In that meet, Dave Burkinshaw won the 600 meter race and Kevin Blackwood won the 55 meter dash.

Two weeks later, the team traveled to Dartmouth College for the Tri-State championship meet. In a virtual repeat of the state meet, the Astros again edged Nashua and Portsmouth, winning by three points. Tomaini was the only individual champion, winning the two mile.

While the track team was running wild those few weeks, the two area girls' basketball teams were doing some pretty impressive things, too.

For Pinkerton, senior forward Mia Barry sank a last-minute free-throw to help the Astros beat Concord, 42-41, in the Class L semi-finals.

Londonderry's Lancers, meanwhile, came up with a 56-38 win over Berlin in the Class I quarter-finals.

The Lancers were led in that game by Terry Ollila and Kathy and Amy Hudson.

Both were stopped in the semi-finals at Concord. Pinkerton was beaten by Milford, 41-31. The next

night, Londonderry lost to Laconia, 61-49.

The week of March 5, the Londonderry Panther Pop Warner football organization had three teams nationally-ranked. The Mid-

gets were rated eighth.

The next week, the Calvary Christian School basketball teams won the New England Christian School League championships. For the girls, it was the third champion-

ship in a row.

In late March and early April, two Pinkerton coaches resigned.

Jim Fletcher left his position as boys' basketball coach to continue his studies, and baseball coach Jim Tagalakis took the coaching position

at New Hampshire College.

At the end of April Hoodcroft Country Club appointed Buffy Labombarda as the team's Club Pro, replacing Scott McAfee.

On May 17, Bill Killen won the annual Hoodcroft Open golf tournament.

Out in New York, two Derry men were helping the West Point lacrosse team to a surprising third-in-the-nation ranking. Sophomore Paul Cino and senior Steve Krikorian were vital players on the Army squad, which was beaten by Navy in the NCAA playoffs.

Cino was later chosen All-American for his efforts, and Krikorian was voted the team's most improved player.

In June, Londonderry High School's track program was at it again. This time, the boys' spring team took second in Class I. In that meet, Blackwood won the 100 and 200 meter races. Over in Class L, Jim Fitzgibbons, Kevin Coyle and Jim Davis of Pinkerton all qualified for the state Meet of Champions, while the Astro girls were fifth in Class L.

Pinkerton Academy's softball team, under coach Linda Royce, pulled off a few of its own miracles in 1981. The Astros won their last four games of the season to edge their way into the tournament. In the final game against Memorial, which they had to win, the Astros trailed by a score of 6-3 in the sixth, but came back for a 9-6 win.

Unfortunately, they faced a tough West team in the opening round, and lost, 7-1.

In mid-June, Cape Cod Tech's Tony Carnovale was appointed the head coach of the Pinkerton basketball team.

That same week, Pinkerton lacrosse player Todd Langton joined the long list of players to be named high school All-American. Langton is now attending Tufts University.

On June 13, Manchester's Ray Currier won the Allen Dodge Road Race.

On June 21, Jim Fitzgibbons of Windham, who had just recently graduated from Pinkerton, saw a year of hard work pay off. Fitz pulled away from the pack to win the two-day decathlon, held at Nashua High School. Fitzgibbons beat out rival Kevin Hall for the championship.

Fitzgibbons is now attending Lowell University.

In early July, the coaches kept

coming and going at Pinkerton. Boys' spring track coach Jane Shanklin announced she was leaving her coaching position. Mike Garvish was named as her replacement. Bill Seres was moved up from his job as freshman baseball coach to take over the varsity position, and John Barry resigned as lacrosse coach. Barry was replaced by Brian O'Reilly.

In late July three Pinkerton soccer players, along with coach John Mitchell, took part in New Hampshire's 3-1 Lion's Cup win over Vermont.

Mike Farrington started in goal for New Hampshire, while Scott True played much of the game at fullback and John Schlichte scored one of the Granite State goals.

That same week, the Derry Little League all-stars were moving up in the state tournament, only to see their championship hopes ended in the quarter-finals. Londonderry's all-stars, meanwhile, were runners-up in a Nashua tournament.

Derry's Babe Ruth all-stars beat Londonderry, then were beaten in the championship game by Merrimack, 3-1.

In early August, Derry golfer Kris Allen shot a miserable 83 in the opening round of the New Hampshire Women's Golf Association

Championship. Allen, a three time winner of the tournament, finished well behind the front-runners in the tourney.

On August 8 in Hanover, Pinkerton graduates Rick Michaels and Jim Davis helped New Hampshire to a 24-0 win over Vermont in the Shrine Maple Sugar game.

Michaels started at quarterback, and Davis played most of the game at defensive back.

On the week of August 20, Londonderry's Little League all-stars won the New Hampshire Independent Baseball championship, with a 14-3 final game thrashing of Nashua.

Also that week, 20-year old Tony Zdunko became the youngest ever Hoodcroft Club champion, beating Charlie Tambouris, six-and-five.

The fall season got underway in late August, with the Londonderry High School soccer team beating Pinkerton in a shoot-out in the Astro Invitational. The Lancers went on to win the jamboree.

On September 19, the Londonderry High School football team won its first-ever varsity game, 7-6, beating Exeter in overtime.

On September 26, the Pinkerton girls' cross-country team continued to dominate the Manchester Invitational, winning that meet for the fifth consecutive year.

The next week, the Astros won the Portsmouth Relays.

Pinkerton's football team won its first big game of the season on October 10, coming from behind to edge the Milford Spartans, 20-17. The Astros trailed at one point, 17-7.

On October 31, the Londonderry boys' cross-country team, under coach Larry Martin, won the Class I championship, stunning pre-meet favorite Laconia.

In Class L, Pinkerton's girls were second and the boys' team was fourth.

That same week, the Londonderry boys' soccer team was beaten by Keene, 3-0, in the opening round of the Division AA tourney. The loss ended the Lancers' season. Coached by Paul Bonneville, they had only one regular-season loss.

In the state cross-country championship, both the Londonderry boys' team and Pinkerton girls' team were third in their respective meets.

On November 5, eventual Division AA champions White Mountain beat the Pinkerton soccer team in a shoot-out in the semi-finals. Pinkerton had a 1-0 lead on a Kevin Tremblay goal, but a controversial penalty gave the Spartans a penalty kick and a goal. In the shoot-out, the Spartans scored one goal, while holding the Astros scoreless.

In the girls soccer state semi-finals, Milford beat Pinkerton, 2-0. The Astros had beaten Oyster River in the quarter-finals.

On November 13, Londonderry High School's field hockey team finally got the one thing that had been eluding them the previous three years - a Division AA championship.

The Lancers beat Goffstown in the semi-finals, then went into overtime to beat Berlin for the championship.

On November 14, Pinkerton and Laconia battled through four scoreless quarters in the Division II semi-final football game. Finally, in overtime, Pinkerton's John McKinney rammed home a field goal, giving the Astros a 3-0 win and a trip to Somersworth for the championship game.

In that game, the Somersworth 'Toppers proved that they are probably the best team in the state, beating Pinkerton soundly, 28-2.

Pinkerton trailed at the half, 28-0, in that game.

On November 22, Derry's Paul Oparowski won the 5.9 mile Turkey Trot, easily beating Manchester's Ray Currier.

That same week, Pinkerton girls' soccer coach Kathy O'Connell was chosen state coach of the year for leading the surprising Astros into the state semi-finals this year.

Timberlane's Morsch, Central's Abbott Win Top Honors

Peggy Morsch of Timberlane Regional in Plaistow rates the selection as Coach of the Year. Manchester Central is the Team of the Year and one of its athletes, Ellen Abbott, has been chosen Athlete of the Year by the New Hampshire Winter Track Coaches.

Announcement of those selections along with all members of the State's Winter Track League All-Star Team was made by Larry Martin, chairman, NHIAA Winter Track and meet director of the New Hampshire Winter Track League.

Members of the All-Star contingent were picked for their regular-season performances along with their finishes in the state meet, explained Martin, who also coaches Londonderry High.

The background on the various selections of the winter track coaches:

COACH OF THE YEAR

Peggy Morsch, Timberlane: In her second year, she led the Owls to their best winter track season ever, compiling a 23-6 regular-season mark and a fourth-place finish in the state. In her two years, Timberlane has posted a 39-14 overall record and this year, her team boasted two individual state champs. Morsch also coaches cross-country and spring track.

TEAM OF THE YEAR

Manchester Central: The Little green compiled the only undefeated regular season record of 21-0, easily annexing the Manchester City

Meet for the second year in a row. Their second-place finish in the state meet is their highest ever in winter track.

ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Ellen Abbott, Manchester Central: The senior captain also was named to the All-State Team in the 3000-meter run. She set the tone for excellence during the regular campaign, posting the fastest times in four events, the 600m, 1000m, 1500m and 3000m. In the state meet, Abbott won the 3000-meter run in record time of 10:44.1 while also placing second in the 1500m and fifth in the 600m run.

THE OTHER SELECTIONS

Sheri Gagnon, Nashua High, 55-meter hurdles: The senior tri-captain helped pace her team to its first winter track state title by competing and scoring in four individual events. Her personal best 8.1 time in the 55m hurdles placed second while she also was second in the 300m dash, third in the long jump and fourth in the 55m dash. Gagnon also is defending New England 100m hurdle champion in spring track.

Robin Worthley, Spaulding, 55-meter dash: The senior sprinter from Rochester was one of the top seeds entering the state meet in 55-meter dash and 55-meter hurdles. Her 7.3 time in the 55m dash captured second spot while her 8.1 in the 55m hurdles earned her a state record and title. She also competed in the 300m dash and

was a member of Spaulding's mile relay team.

Sherri Hughes, Pinkerton Academy, 300-meter dash: Only a sophomore, she is the only repeat All-State pick, last year having been named in the 55m dash. Hughes' 42.6 performance in the 300m dash this year, earned her the state title as well as establishing a state record. Hughes also captured two third-place finishes for the Astros in the 55m and 55m hurdles.

Darcy Smith, Keene High, shot put: Undefeated during the regular season, Smith established a state record in the shot put with her winning performance of 40 feet, 8 inches. She also reigns as state record holder and defending state champion in the shot put in spring track.

Sara Belyea, Somersworth, high jump: The senior posted the best jump of the regular season, clearing the bar at 5 ft., 1 inch. In the State Meet, she placed second overall with a jump of five feet. Belyea also qualified for, and competed in, the 55-meter hurdles.

Patsy Booker, Timberlane, 600-meter run: The junior sprinter is in her third competitive season. Moving up to the 600-meter run for the first time this season, Booker's 1:41.6 first-place performance set a state record. Booker also qualified for, and competed in, the 300m dash as well as being a member of the Owls' mile relay team.

Leslie Nichols, Exeter, 1000-meter run: During the regular season, Nichols proved to be a

versatile performer as she ran and qualified in four individual events for the Blue Hawks, the 300m dash, 600m run, 1000m run and 1500m run. In State Meet competition, her season best time of 3:09.6 placed second overall in the 1000m. She also competed in the 300m dash.

Beth Latham, Pinkerton Academy, 1500-meter run: Last year's 3000-meter state champ, she again ranked among the top distance runners during the regular season in the 1500m and 3000m runs. In the State Meet, she ran season-best times in both events while capturing fourth in the 1500m and second in the 3000m.


Mile Relay Team, Nashua High: Lisa Laford, Reta Laford, Denise Gregoire, Maria Peahl, Sheri Gagnon and Cecelia Kindgren all share in the honor of the Purple Panthers being named All-State Mile Relay Team. Nashua utilized all six girls to post the fastest time in the state this season, a 4:13.3, as well as placing second in the State Meet running their fastest time ever on the UNH track, a 4:19.3.

Cecilia Kindgren, Nashua High, long jump: The junior exchange student from Sweden was welcomed addition to the Purple Panthers the past season. Posting the best jump of the regular season of 17 feet, 5 inches, she was the top seed going into the State Meet where her jump of 17 feet, four-and-one-half inches was second overall while her 7.2 performance in the 55-meter dash captured first-place honors and a state record.
